# **RIVER PARTNERS NEWS**

In November 2021, the Roanoke River was authorized by the NC Legislature as the 12<sup>th</sup> State Trail in North Carolina. We are currently working to gain approval by NC State Trails as part of the application designation process.

Be on the lookout for upcoming signage that will feature the Roanoke River State Trail (RRST) blaze at Roanoke River region boat access areas to mark the RRST.

As the nonprofit partner of the RRST, Roanoke River Partners, Inc. is in the process of receiving funding of \$500,000 from the Department of Cultural and Natural Resources as part of the \$29.25 million allocated towards trail funding by the General Assembly. We plan to use half (\$250,000) for camping platform renovations, and half (\$250,000) for renovations to the Hamilton Rosenwald School.

### **Rosenwald News**



We are continuing to search for **funds** to complete the Rosenwald school for use as a multipurpose historic site. This circa-1920 school will be the headquarters for the newly designated Roanoke River State Trail and Roanoke River Partners, Inc.

The completed river center will also serve as a **community center for the Town of Hamilto**n, a depository for Roanoke River history and riverine science exhibits; Roanoke River Underground Railroad history and artifacts exhibits which feature the Roanoke River as a part of the National Underground Railroad Network to Freedom; and an authentic Rosenwald School setting with associated historic artifacts, printed materials, and oral histories. Incorporating both indoor/outdoor gathering space, our completed river/community center will facilitate regional events.

Cost Estimates: (recent price increases are making our efforts more challenging)

Renovation cost of the building:	\$998,347
Cost for parking area, camp site and trail:	\$258,232
Total project cost: Remaining	\$1,256,579

Amount spent in Phase 1 for roof, new windows: \$115,115

Funds on hand in RRP bank for project: \$120,000
State Trails money - incoming \$250,000
Total funding available for Phase 2: \$370,000

Funds needed to begin Phase 2 (would enable use of building): \$693,952 Funds needed to begin Phase 3: \$562,627

### DID YOU KNOW?

#### The Roanoke River

- Longest River in North Carolina (410miles)
- Drains 9,680 square miles (6,195,200 acres)
- The Roanoke River moves more water than any other river in North Carolina
- Average Flow: 7,802 cubic feet per second
- Supports 214 Bird Species
- The Roanoke River Basin is the largest intact bottomland forest east of the Mississippi River
- Between the NC Chapter of the Nature Conservancy, NC Wildlife Resources Commission and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service there are more than 93,000 acres of floodplain forest permanently protected below the Roanoke Rapids Dam.
