Since October 2022, Roanoke River Partners, Inc. has redecked/renovated 92 percent of the campsites for the Roanoke River State Trail at a cost of \$222,000 from funds of the NC Complete the Trails Fund.

RRP is in the development phase of new campsites on the Roanoke River. We are appreciative of the landowners that have shared their property for so many years with users of the Roanoke River State Trail. Stay tuned! The Town of Weldon is renovating their waterfront. A new outtake has recently opened at the NC Wildlife Resources site on the Roanoke River located above the rapids at the foot of the Hwy 301 bridge in Weldon.

Roanoke River State Trail Historic Achievement

On July 10, 2024 the Secretary of Natural and Cultural Resources, Reid Wilson, signed his approval to designate the final 43.6 miles of the Roanoke River State Trail. The RRST became the first North Carolina State Trail to be officially designated for its entire length. RRP has been working on the designation process since it was authorized as a NC State Trail by the General Assembly in November 2021.

The paddle trail begins in Roanoke Rapids, N.C., and follows the river to the Albemarle Sound, extending northward to additional accesses in Chowan County. There are 15 designated access points along the approximately 215-mile scenic wilderness trail. Each state trail has a designated managing partner, and for RRST, that is the nonprofit organization Roanoke River Partners, Inc. (RRP), which includes members from each of the six counties in the Roanoke region — Halifax, Northampton, Bertie, Martin, Chowan, and Washington. It is supported by 15 municipalities along the river and also operates and manages over 20 paddle-in camping platforms on the river.

Fun Fact

The North Carolina state parks system welcomed more than 20.1 million visitors in 2023 and acquired over 2,890 acres of new land, according to the N.C. Division of Parks and Recreation. Visitation at state parks increased by 4% — more than 755,000 — from 2022.

Roanoke River Partners, Inc. received an Impact Award at the Great Trails State Conference on Sept 13, 2024 as the first North Carolina State Trail to be officially designated for its entire length.

The Great Trails State Conference was held in Winston-Salem September 11-13, 2024. The conference brought together more than 300 trail planners, designers and builders, recreational professionals, community and elected leaders, tourism partners, and others from across the state to learn and share best practices to advance trail and greenway development and promotion throughout North Carolina. Chase Conner, Charlotte Griffin and Anne Lunsford were able to represent RRP at the conference due to the generous donation from UPLIFT.



Rosenwald River Center

The Roanoke River Partners, Inc. has been set on "GO" since 2023 to begin renovations of the circa 1920 Hamilton Rosenwald School for use as the headquarters for the Roanoke River Partners, Inc. and the Roanoke River State Trail and as a multipurpose event site. RRP received an award of \$20,000 in June 2024 from Dominion Charitable Foundation. The cumbersome process for the previously awarded CBDG grant required an environmental review which has FINALLY been completed. The review by the NC Department of Commerce and HUD is being completed. If approved, the next step is RFP, Request for Proposal to solicit bids from qualified contractors. We are closer to our goals as work can be done in phases based on funds available. Our tireless champion, Town of Bear Grass Mayor Charlotte Griffin, continues to push this project forward.

Ross was an early architect, a trailblazer, and he really initiated focus on river tourism through the potential he saw in the region which later developed and became the Roanoke River Paddle Trail. He worked in Weldon and was contacted by a group of blind English canoeists that wanted to start in Weldon to take a week to paddle to the Albemarle Sound. Ross set about contacting people along the river to put together a tour for the group. The successful trip was well-received! Ross was instrumental in having the vision and putting people together in our five-county region to explore ecotourism possibilities and infrastructure needs on the Roanoke River. He was such a positive and eager leader in the critical first years of RRP with energy, a smile, and a can-do attitude that was never put off by barriers. He was always encouraging with ideas that were critical in helping shape the trail and also many projects in the towns especially Weldon. Thank you Ross, our friend, for your vision and spirit. May his legacy continue to guide our work.
